Understanding Families in Need This Holiday Season

- In Guatemala, 26% of the population lives on less than \$2 per day and 54% live below the country's poverty line.
- Due to the pandemic, families already living on less than \$300/month are out of work and unable to earn a wage.
- Internet access and mobile phone data is needed more than ever for distance learning, access to telehealth, and being able to contact Common Hope social workers and vital programming.
- Food insecurity is among the top concerns for families during this crisis.
- Educational programming from schools is inconsistent and inadequate. Supporting students' educational health is as important as their physical health.



Pequeños Hermanos - NPH, Spanish for "Our Little Brothers and Sisters"

Through NPH a loving, supportive home is provided to nearly 3,300 vulnerable boys and girls living in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua and Peru. An additional 2,800 children who live outside the NPH homes receive scholarships, meals and healthcare. NPH community outreach programs provided over 107,000 services in 2019.

Located on the corner of Lake Street and Bloomington Avenue, this building was badly damaged by looting during the unrest in Minneapolis following the tragic killing of Mr. George Floyd in the spring of 2020. The looting

resulted in great losses to the small business owners whose shops are located in Mercado, many of whom had been struggling to stay in business during the restrictions in place because of the COVID-19 Pan-



demic. Generous food & cash donations from WBLUMC members provided groceries and hygiene supplies to families over the summer and 2 chickens for each family for Thanksgiving 2020—a total of 72 fresh chickens for feasting!
